Eligibility

- Entry is open to any member of the public of 16 years of age or older;
- A parent of any entrant older than 16, but younger than 18 must complete the below parental declaration;
- All sailing cruisers must have a draught equal to or less than 1.8 metres. All dinghies a Portsmouth yardstick equal to or greater than 1390.
- No boat may race without having previously submitted a signed Entry Form.
- Once only completion and submission of this form enables a boat to enter the 2023 SSC Summer Series, the 2023 SSC Autumn Series, or both.

Entry fees and results

- There is no entry fee. However, this is a charity fund raising event and we encourage entrants to support the Red Cross Ukraine Crisis Appeal by gathering sponsorship on a per-lap basis from friends and family, or by giving lump sum donations. Southampton Sailing Club - Safety Policy



All competitors

- No starter will be accepted without SSC being in receipt of a signed entry form.
- SSC reserve the right to refuse or cancel an entry on safety grounds.
- All competitors are reminded to:
 - Be aware of wash from passing vessels and the associated risk of trips and falls;
 - Remain outside the dredged channel. Any competitor failing to adhere will be disqualified.
- Competitors should be confident to handle their craft within the expected conditions. For guidance, dinghy and multihull sailors should have an equivalent level of competence to RYA level 2, and cruiser sailors an equivalent level of competence to RYA Day skipper.
- Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each
 competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport, and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
 - They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat, and their other property whether afloat or ashore. This includes:
 - > Their decision to start or continue a race, taking into consideration their level of equipment, crew ability and experience, and other factors as listed in the sailing Instructions.
 - > Induction of their crew with respect to man-overboard procedures.
 - o They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.
 - Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
 - The provision of a race management team, and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
 - o In the event of an incident on the water e.g. MOB, collision, dismasting, grounding, it is the duty of competitors to stand by and offer assistance to the affected vessel. Such action may be reported to the Race Officer and redress given.
 - They are responsible for ensuring that their boat is equipped and seaworthy so as to be able to face extremes of weather; that
 there is a crew sufficient in number, experience and fitness to withstand such weather; and that the safety equipment is
 properly maintained, stowed and in date and is familiar to the crew;
 - When in close quarters situations with other vessels, competitors are reminded of their statutory and over-riding obligation under the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collision at Sea to avoid collisions.

Entrants of dinghies and small multihulls

Will ensure:

- Personal buoyancy¹ shall be worn at all times. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal buoyancy.
- Ensure their boats are appropriately equipped with a paddle (for dinghies that are not self draining, also a bailer);
- Either a mobile phone within a waterproof pouch, or a portable and waterproof VHF radio will be carried.
- Where appropriate, consideration will be given to the use of masthead flotation.

Entrants of Sailing Cruisers

Competitors entering sailing cruisers are reminded of their responsibilities to:

- Wear lifejackets when the committee boat flies code flag Y;
- Maintain a listening watch on VHF Ch37 (M1) (P1);
- Use of your yacht's engine if necessary, to avoid any dangerous situation. The circumstances should be subsequently reported to the race officer. Dependant on the facts, you will not necessarily be penalised;
- o If competitors are unsure that a Man Overboard (MOB) can be quickly recovered, an immediate Mayday call via channel 16
- o In the event of minor injuries, advice may be sought from HM Coatguard via channel 37 as necessary. In the event of a medical emergency, a Pan Pan, or Mayday call via channel 16 should be considered.
- SSC's expectation is that sailing cruisers should be more independent than dinghies with respect to their ability to handle emergency situations. Hence, as a minimum, all sailing cruisers competing in the Series shall carry:
 - One strong bucket with a lanyard and of at least 9 litres capacity;
 - One compass (a hand-held is acceptable);
 - One fire extinguisher;
 - one anchor and warp;
 - > A lifebuoy with a drogue;
 - A heaving line, no less than 6 mm (1/4") diameter, 15 -25 m long, readily accessible to cockpit;
 - A strong, sharp knife readily accessible from the deck or a cockpit;
 - > Each crew member shall have a lifejacket.
 - At least two red hand flares and two orange smoke flares, in a waterproof container;
 - First aid kit;
 - > VHF radio.

All sailing cruisers must have on board a functioning auxiliary engine.
